
Sweeney Todd

During the 2021-2022 season, Mr. Burdette returned to the Metropolitan Opera as the Police Officer in *Boris Godunov*, to Seattle Opera as Bartolo in *Le nozze di Figaro*, and Santa Fe Opera for Bartolo in *Il barbiere di Siviglia* and Manuel


Mezzo-soprano Eve Gigliotti is a multi-faceted artist who has won critical acclaim for her work spanning both the dramatic repertoire and contemporary opera, including originating the roles of Ruth in the world premiere of Dark Sisters (Muhly/Karam), and Dodo in the world premiere of Breaking the Waves (Mazzoli/Vavrek). During the 2021/2022 season Ms. Gigliotti returned to The Metropolitan Opera with roles in Elektra, The Rake's Progress, Rigoletto, and Boris Gudonov, and performed Madame de la Haltière in their English adaptation of Cendrillon and Queen Gertrude in Brett Dean's groundbreaking Hamlet. She was featured as Alto Soloist with American Symphony Orchestra at Carnegie Hall in the North American premiere of Taneyev's At The Reading of a Psalm. This past season, Eve sang multiple roles at The Metropolitan Opera including Nelly in the world premiere of The Hours, and Marie in Der Fliegende Holländer. She returned to the PROTOTYPE Festival as the alto soloist in Here Lies Joy, and joined the American Symphony Orchestra for Ethel Smyth's Mass in D. She continues her work as creative producer with the opera No One Is Forgotten currently in development. Her collaborative short film 'A Jarful of Bees' was featured at Opera Philadelphia's Season O22 film festival and the Opera Philadelphia Channel.

Other role highlights include Basilio in *II barbiere di Siviglia* with Chautauqua and Virginia Operas, Guglielmo and Don Alfonso in *Così fan tutte* with Opera Grand Rapids and Charlottesville Opera, The Sergeant of Police in *The Pirates of Penzance* with Dayton Opera, Dottore Grenvil in *La traviata* with Kansas City Lyric Opera, Toledo Opera, and Opera on the James, and Leporello in *Don Giovanni* with The Janiec Opera Company.

Concert credits include Handel's *Messiah* with the Dayton Philharmonic, Mozart's *Requiem* with The Virginia Consort, and Verdi's *Requiem* with Utah Festival Opera & Musical Theatre.

A native of Grand Rapids, Michigan, Michael earned degrees from Baylor University, The University of Kansas, and Indiana University.




Amanda Lynn Bottoms




Angela Yam



In 2023, he performed in Sam Smith's Gloria choir alongside Sharon Stone on Saturday Night Live.




Felix Aguilar Tomlinson


Dennis Whitehead Darling is an award-winning Stage Director working in opera, theatre, musical theatre and film. His recent directing credits include: World Premieres of Marian's Song (Houston Grand Opera), Sanctuary Road (North Carolina Opera), "Why I Live at the PO" (UrbanArias), Buried Deep (End Station Theatre) and *The Secret River* (Opera Orlando). Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street

STEPHEN SONDHEIM wrote the music and lyrics for Saturday Night (1954), A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum (1962), Anyone Can Whistle (1964), Company (1970), Follies (1971), A Little Night Music (1973), The Frogs (1974), Pacific Overtures (1976), Sweeney Todd (1979), Merrily We Roll Along (1981), Sunday in the Park with George (1984), Into the Woods (1987), Assassins (1991), Passion (1994) and Road Show (2008) as well as lyrics for West Side Story (1957), Gypsy (1959) and Do I Hear A Waltz? (1965) and additional lyrics for Candide (1973). Anthologies of his work include Side by Side by Sondheim (1976), Marry Me A Little (1981), You're Gonna Love Tomorrow (1983), Putting it Together (1993/99) and Sondheim on Sondheim (2010). He composed the scores of the films "Stavisky" (1974) and "Reds" (1981) and songs for "Dick Tracy" (1990) and the television production "Evening Primrose" (1966). His collected lyrics with attendant essays have been published in two volumes: "Finishing the Hat" (2010) and "Look, I Made A Hat" (2011). In 2010 Broadway's Henry Miller's Theatre was renamed The Stephen Sondheim Theatre in his honor; in 2019, London's Queens Theatre was also renamed the Sondheim.




Hugh Wheeler

Book Writer

Hugh Wheeler was a novelist, playwright and screen writer. He wrote more than thirty mystery novels under the pseudonyms Q. Patrick and Patrick Quentin, and four of his novels were transformed into films: Black Widow, Man in the Net, The Green-Eyed Monster and The Man with Two Wives. For films he wrote the screenplays for Travels with My Aunt, Something for Everyone, A Little Night Music, and Nijinsky. His plays include Big Fish, Little Fish (1961), Look: We've Come Through (1961) and We Have Always Lived in the Castle (1966, adapted from the Shirley Jackson novel), he co-authored with Joseph Stein the book for a new production of the 1919 musical Irene (1973), wrote the books for A Little Night Music (1973), a new production of Candide (1973), Sweeney Todd, the Demon Barber of Fleet Street (1979, based on a version of the play by Christopher Bond), and Meet Me in St. Louis





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(adapted from the 1949 M-G-M musical), contributed additional material for the musical *Pacific Overtures* (1976), and wrote a new adaptation of the Kurt Weill opera *Silverlake*, which was directed by Harold Prince at the New York Opera. He received Tony and Drama Desk Awards for *A Little Night Music, Candide* and *Sweeney Todd*. Prior to his death in 1987 Mr. Wheeler was working on two new musicals, *Bodo* and *Fu Manchu*, and a new adaptation of *The Merry Widow*.
