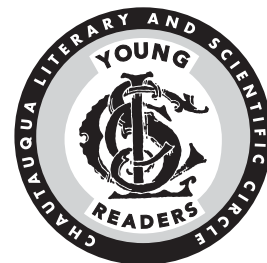


# CLSC YOUNG READERS
