In the blink of an eye, she reaches her 18th birthday, hurtles toward her 41st, accelerates into her 70th, and glides into her 101st. *Birthday Candles* is a heartfelt and humorous story that guides the audience through the significant, challenging, and remarkable moments as time inexorably marches on. One ordinary woman's life is measured by the simple tradition of baking a birthday cake.

Originally developed as a New Play Workshop during the 2017 season and then performed around the country, Chautauqua will finally mount its own full production of *Birthday Candles*. What a fitting way to open CTC's mainstage season and celebrate Chautauqua Institution's 150th birthday!

A Message from Producing Artistic Director

Note from Jade King Carroll

During this very special season, we invite you to reflect on our legacy as we launch into the future. Ten years ago, when I first came to Chautauqua Theater Company (CTC) to direct *The*



July 05 21, 2024 Tempest, I walked into Bratton and was immediately captivated by this gorgeous ship-like theater. The magic of theater lies in its ability to transport you anywhere. What better vessel to take you on these journeys than Bratton Theater?

This year is a season of birthdays. We are celebrating both the Institution's 150th birthday and the Friends of Chautauqua Theater's (FCT) 30th birthday. The Young Playwrights Project is celebrating 10 years of local community involvement. Twenty-four years ago, the FCT, with the help of a successful capital campaign, transformed Normal Hall into the stunning theater we are all sitting in today.

CTC is thrilled to offer plays at every stage of their life cycle this summer, starting with the homecoming of Noah Haidle's Birthday Candles. This play, which was a new play workshop in 2017, has since been produced across the country, on Broadway, and around the world. *Birthday Candles* is a play about home, the magnitude of life, and the universe, as told through seemingly small, everyday moments. Next, we present a 20-year-old contemporary American classic, Fabulation, an allegorical play that I have long admired — it's audacity, humor, and horror of perception and expectation, all presented through an extremely satirical lens. Satire has become an increasingly necessary genre in what can seem to be an increasingly absurd world. It's a riches-to-rags, coming-of-age story of selfdiscovery that unearths archetypes and makes us look more discerningly at the things and people we might take for granted. It is written by one of America's most important living playwrights, Lynn Nottage. The final main stage production of the season is the world premiere of CTC's very own commissioned play The

Light and The Dark: the life and times of Artemisia Gentileschi, by Kate Hamill, starring the playwright herself as Artemisia. This classic tale tells the story of this oft-forgotten visionary artist and brave woman, Artemisia Gentileschi, the great Italian Renaissance painter.

It is an incredible honor to have all our playwrights joining us this summer and it's no coincidence that we are welcoming almost all of them back home to Bratton and CTC. Noah Haidle was last here to workshop *Birthday Candles* in 2017. Lynn Nottage's *Intimate Apparel* was beautifully produced in 2015, and just last year I kicked off my tenure as Producing Artistic Director with Kate Hamill's *Pride and Prejudice*.



July 05 21, 2024 This summer, we are thrilled to welcome back commissioned artist C.A. Johnson, who joined us last season on the grounds for a writing residency, working on the first draft of *Tell Me You're Dying: the trial of millicent bonhomme*. We are also welcoming back Anna Ziegler, who was with us as part of our signature NPW platform in 2008 and 2010 and is returning this year with a brand-new play, *Celebrating 65 years of the Ladies' Home Journal in Cambridge, Massachusetts!* For our final staged new play workshop, we are pleased to welcome Hilary Bettis and her beautiful coming-of-age story, *falcon girls*.

I'm also thrilled to announce that we have partnered with the Drama League, the preeminent creative development home for directors, based in New York City. We now have three fabulous directing fellows who will be presenting their own *Night of One Acts*, with works by José Rivera, Bill Harris and Caryl Churchill. And what a perfect year to return to Bratton Late Night, also under the direction of one of these talented fellows!

If CTC's season were to have an actual birthday party, it would be on Aug. 1, for the homecoming of our former artistic directors who will be performing in a benefit reading of the brilliant classic Old Times by Harold Pinter. This will be a celebration of the past 150 years as we look forward to the next 150, and beyond. Prior to this performance, we will be celebrating the announcement of the future Roe Green Theater Center. The vision for this new building — both a replacement of our dilapidated theater offices and former rehearsal studios, and an expansion of our capabilities with a state-of-the-art black box theater — has long been a dream. Now, that dream is starting to turn into a reality. The Roe Green Foundation has made a transformational gift of \$4.5 million, of which \$1.5 million is a matching challenge. Please consider supporting the theater in whatever way you can — we cannot fully realize this dream without your support! A Message From the Playwright

Note from Noah Haidle

In this theater seven years ago, *Birthday Candles* had its first encounter with the public. Since then, it's been produced in Buenos Aires, Stockholm, Chicago, Riga, Tel Aviv, New York City, and Berlin. And now it has returned home.

Home because the play was born here, without hyperbole. After the first workshop showing, an audience member asked me onstage, "What was so difficult about Ernestine's life?" (Ernestine is the name of the main character, but it's in the program you're holding so that's not much of a spoiler). Out loud, I can't remember my reply, but inside, I was like, "Oh shit, she's right."

Writing a play is, in essence, building a simple machine whose effect can be repeated ad infinitum, like a ladder or a corkscrew. I couldn't be more thrilled that Chautauqua Theater Company's production of Birthday Candles is the first I'll have seen with which I have had no direct involvement and, therefore, a measure of the efficacy of the machine invented here.

And to that audience member who asked the seminal question in the life of this play, I hope you're satisfied with my response.

A Message From The Director

Note from Arya Shahi

Birthday Candles by Noah Haidle is my favorite kind of a play. It turns the ordinary extraordinary. It makes the mundane mythic. This play is pure surprise in the same way our long lives feel short in retrospect. The story lasts a century in the time it takes to bake a single birthday cake. And when it's over, everything has changed but nothing is different. Now, perhaps you're sitting down in our theater after a very-rigorous-intellectually-stimulating-day-of-real-world-living and my words strike you as simplistic or overly sentimental ... but I've spent



July 05 21, 2024 the past six months enrapt by this script and that is the effect (and the genius) of Noah Haidle. He boils our complex lives down to their core ingredients. He will make a poet of you.

The cast and creative team have been nothing short of tremendous, bold, and bravely weird in their exploration of these ideas. Each designer was tasked with creating a world that feels real while existing just outside of realism. The resulting space is a place where the heart, the mind, and the imagination can all throw a party together. Each actor was asked to be constantly present, literally and figuratively, jumping through life at its most beautiful, and brutal, and romantic, and ridiculous, establishing — then breaking — the routines that end up defining us. As a director, I must take a moment to acknowledge this gargantuan task. What the cast, crew, and creative team have accomplished here is not easy, but their dedication has made it look simple.

How lucky I am to have helped tell this story with these people this summer. Like Atman The Goldfish, our star actor with a three-second memory span, I wish I could forget the show and see it anew each night. But instead, I get the second best thing: I get to offer you "the genius of a party. A rest. A song. A wish. A breath. And then home."

Playwright

Noah Haidle is a playwright and screenwriter whose work has been produced on Broadway, Off-Broadway and worldwide. His play *Birthday Candles* was workshopped as a part of the New Play Workshop series in 2017 and went on to be produced on Broadway at American Airlines Theater. His Off-Broadway plays include *Mr. Marmalade*, *Saturn Returns*, *Smokefall*, and *Kitty Kitty Kitty. Vigils*, *Persephone*, and *Princess Marjorie* were performed regionally. Internationally, 10 of his plays have been solely produced in Germany, one of which, The Homemaker, won the German Theater Critics Prize for Best Foreign Play in 2015. He also served as the playwright-in-residence at the National Theater of Mannheim, Germany, a position first held by Friedrich Schiller in 1785. Additional writing credits include "Stand Up Guys" (film), starring Al Pacino, Christopher Walken and Alan Arkin, and "Kidding" (TV), starring Jim Carrey.

He is the recipient of three Lincoln Center Le Compte Du Nuoy Awards, a Helen Merrill Award, the Claire Tow Award, and an NEA/TCG theatre residency grant. Mr. Haidle has taught playwrighting at Princeton University, The Kennedy Center, and in Kenya and Uganda as part of The Sundance Theatre Institute. He earned his bachelor's degree in arts from Princeton University and an Artist Diploma from The Juilliard School, where he was a Lila Acheson Wallace playwright-inresidence.


