Undine is a powerful and successful business owner basking in the glory of all her accomplishments. She has everything from wealth to love and a fabulous wardrobe to match, but life has a wicked sense of humor. The man she believes is the love of her life pulls the ultimate disappearing act, stealing everything and leaving her pregnant and penniless. Plummeting down the precarious ladder of society, Undine finds herself grappling with the disintegration of her once-perfect life as she is forced to return to her humble roots in Brooklyn and the family she once abandoned. Can Undine manifest her future without acknowledging her past?

Fabulation is a sharp-witted satirical comedy that takes us from riches to rags, through twists and turns, and reveals the unexpected joys within chaos.

This production includes adult content — depictions of drug use and harsh language — and may not be suitable for youth 13 and under.



The magic of theater lies in its ability to transport you anywhere. What better vessel to take you on these journeys than Bratton Theater?



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
This year is a season of birthdays. We are celebrating both the Institution's 150th birthday and the Friends of Chautauqua Theater's (FCT) 30th birthday. The Young Playwrights Project is celebrating 10 years of local community involvement. Twenty-four years ago, the FCT, with the help of a successful capital campaign, transformed Normal Hall into the stunning theater we are all sitting in today.

CTC is thrilled to offer plays at every stage of their life cycle this summer, starting with the homecoming of Noah Haidle's Birthday Candles. This play, which was a new play workshop in 2017, has since been produced across the country, on Broadway, and around the world. *Birthday Candles* is a play about home, the magnitude of life, and the universe, as told through seemingly small, everyday moments. Next, we present a 20-year-old contemporary American classic, Fabulation, an allegorical play that I have long admired — it's audacity, humor, and horror of perception and expectation, all presented through an extremely satirical lens. Satire has become an increasingly necessary genre in what can seem to be an increasingly absurd world. It's a riches-to-rags, coming-of-age story of selfdiscovery that unearths archetypes and makes us look more discerningly at the things and people we might take for granted. It is written by one of America's most important living playwrights, Lynn Nottage. The final main stage production of the season is the world premiere of CTC's very own commissioned play The

Light and The Dark: the life and times of Artemisia Gentileschi, by Kate Hamill, starring the playwright herself as Artemisia. This classic tale tells the story of this oft-forgotten visionary artist and brave woman, Artemisia Gentileschi, the great Italian Renaissance painter.

It is an incredible honor to have all our playwrights joining us this summer and it's no coincidence that we are welcoming almost all of them back home to Bratton and CTC. Noah Haidle was last here to workshop *Birthday Candles* in 2017. Lynn Nottage's *Intimate Apparel* was beautifully produced in 2015, and just last year I kicked off my tenure as Producing Artistic Director with Kate Hamill's *Pride and Prejudice*.

This summer, we are thrilled to welcome back commissioned artist C.A. Johnson, who joined us last season on the grounds for a writing residency, working on the first draft of *Tell Me You're Dying: the trial of millicent bonhomme*. We are also welcoming back Anna Ziegler, who was with us as part of our



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signature NPW platform in 2008 and 2010 and is returning this year with a brand-new play, *Celebrating 65 years of the Ladies' Home Journal in Cambridge, Massachusetts!* For our final staged new play workshop, we are pleased to welcome Hilary Bettis and her beautiful coming-of-age story, *falcon girls*.


I'm also thrilled to announce that we have partnered with the Drama League, the preeminent creative development home for directors, based in New York City. We now have three fabulous directing fellows who will be presenting their own *Night of One Acts*, with works by José Rivera, Bill Harris and Caryl Churchill. And what a perfect year to return to Bratton Late Night, also under the direction of one of these talented fellows!

If CTC's season were to have an actual birthday party, it would be on Aug. 1, for the homecoming of our former artistic directors who will be performing in a benefit reading of the brilliant classic Old Times by Harold Pinter. This will be a celebration of the past 150 years as we look forward to the next 150, and beyond. Prior to this performance, we will be celebrating the announcement of the future Roe Green Theater Center. The vision for this new building — both a replacement of our dilapidated theater offices and former rehearsal studios, and an expansion of our capabilities with a state-of-the-art black box theater — has long been a dream. Now, that dream is starting to turn into a reality. The Roe Green Foundation has made a transformational gift of \$4.5 million, of which \$1.5 million is a matching challenge. A Message from the Director



Fabulation or, the Re-Education of Undine

When you find yourself inside a Lynn Nottage play you go on an intimate ride with her characters. In Fabulation, we journey with a Black woman, Undine, who gets sent down a rabbit hole back to a place she's avoided for fourteen years; Home. As the company and I ventured through the rehearsal process, we truly fell in love with the wild mash up of characters Undine meets and rediscovers back home. Through Undine's lens, we see the flaws in an American system that her "new money" won't hide. Of all of her losses, abandoning her history and her people costs the most. Nottage has this truthful, brave way of presenting a kaleidoscope of characters in Fabulation that everyone witnessing can relate to their humanity and audacity. The boldness that I've witnessed onstage by way of our stellar company of actors has beaconed deep vulnerability, recognition, and empathy in the ways that only a satirical comedy can do. Their work affirms that the greatest satirical comedies warm our bellies and send us thinking. The vibrancy and authenticity in the design has been a celebration of the fabric of America; Black and Brown people hold the pulse and looking good doing so. I've meditated a lot about the heart of New York- the people who keep the city and furthermore, America alive.In a 2004 interview in The Brooklyn Rail about Fabulation, Lynn Nottage says "It's about everyone who has drifted away from who they are. One of the things I wanted to examine is how difficult it is to be poor in America right now. You can have all the intelligence in the world and think that you're savvy, but the system is still incredibly difficult to negotiate, and you literally can become trapped in there. And that's what I wanted to show, that this woman who has achieved a certain level of success can go back into the system and realize, 'Oh, I can get stuck.' There is something fundamentally wrong with the system, not with the people who are trapped within it." Most of us, like Undine, sat with a dream and effort to build a life that would usher it into reality. My wish for all of us is that as we orchestrate a life for ourselves, we fortify the soil we are born into along with the gardens of chosen family and communities we create.

Playwright

Lynn Nottage is a playwright, screenwriter, and the first woman in history to win two Pulitzer Prizes for drama. Her plays have been produced widely in the United States and throughout the world. Recent work includes the book for *MJ the Musical* (Broadway), the libretto for the *Intimate Apparel* opera (LCT), and *Clyde's* (Broadway, Second Stage Theater, Goodman Theater), and co-curating the performance installation *The Watering Hole* (Signature Theater).




Jade King Carroll
